

Appendix A: Typical Career Paths

Typical Career Paths for 1740's¹


All 1740's are Education Services Specialists and, within Army, Education Services Specialists are generally found in ACES, USAR, USAREC, and MEPCOM. They are in positions at three levels within Army -- at the DA staff level, at the MACOM staff level, and at the operating level.

The figure on the next page shows the categories of positions at each level and the range of grades for each category of position. Careerists should keep in mind that the grades for positions within a category of positions vary. For example, three factors (student load; variety and complexity of instructional activity; and level of responsibility) are used in determining the grade for an Education Services Officer position.


Within the Education Services career program, there are numerous paths for career progression to key positions. During a careerist's career, some moves may be promotions and some may be lateral moves. The chart on the next page also shows typical paths for moving within and between levels.
